2. Main points

- Labour Force Survey (LFS) estimates have been weighted to latest population estimates for periods from July to September 2022; headline UK seasonally adjusted series prior to this have been modelled, but other series have a discontinuity at this point.
- Increased volatility of LFS estimates, resulting from smaller achieved sample sizes, means that estimates
 of quarterly change should be treated with additional caution, and we recommend using them as part of our
 suite of labour market indicators alongside workforce jobs, Claimant Count data, and Pay As You Earn
 Real Time Information (PAYE RTI) estimates.
- The UK employment rate for December 2023 to February 2024 (74.5%) remains below estimates a year ago (December 2022 to February 2023), and decreased in the latest quarter.
- The UK unemployment rate for December 2023 to February 2024 (4.2%) is above estimates a year ago (December 2022 to February 2023), and increased in the latest quarter.
- The UK economic inactivity rate for December 2023 to February 2024 (22.2%) is above estimates a year ago (December 2022 to February 2023), and increased in the latest quarter.

The ongoing challenges with response rates and levels mean that LFS-based labour market statistics will be badged as official statistics in development until further review.

3. Measuring the labour market

Latest Labour Force Survey (LFS) estimates are based on interviews that took place from December 2023 to February 2024.

Because of coronavirus (COVID-19) and the suspension of face-to-face interviewing, we had to make operational changes to the LFS, which moved to a by-telephone approach. This introduced an increased non-response bias to the survey, which was partially mitigated by the introduction of housing tenure-based weights into the survey in October 2020, as detailed in our <u>Coronavirus and its impact on the Labour Force Survey article</u>.

It was acknowledged that further improvement work was required to deal with the increase in non-response from those with a non-UK country of birth or nationality. As a result, we introduced an adjusted <u>Labour Force weighting methodology</u> in July 2021. Further information is available in our <u>Impact of reweighting on Labour Force Survey key indicators</u>, UK: 2022 article.

From our February 2024 labour market release, LFS periods from July to September 2022 onwards have been reweighted to incorporate the latest estimates of the size and composition of the UK population. This reweighting creates a discontinuity between June to August 2022 and July to September 2022. Users should take this discontinuity into consideration when considering long-term movements in the data time series.

However, we have modelled the seasonally adjusted UK levels of employment, unemployment and economic inactivity by sex and age band back to the start of the population revisions in June to August 2011. This has been done by scaling to the latest population estimates, while taking account of the relative revisions to population by sex and age band in each year over the revision period. This ensures that the headline series in Table 1, Table 2 (1) and Table 2 (2) (also available in datasets A02 SA, A05 SA and A01 Tables 1 and 2) are comparable over the full series.

This reweighting does not address the volatility seen in recent periods and this may be seen to some extent in the future. Therefore, we advise increased caution when interpreting short-term changes in series and recommend using them as part of a suite of labour market indicators, alongside workforce jobs, Claimant Count data and Pay As You Earn Real Time Information (PAYE RTI) estimates. LFS estimates are currently not considered National Statistics and are currently designated as <u>official statistics in development (explained on the Office for Statistics Regulation's website)</u>.

An issue was detected in the weighting of the Labour Force Survey for Northern Ireland for the November 2023 to January 2024 quarter only, which affected the March publication of the Labour Force Survey figures. This issue has now been resolved and the November 2023 to January 2024 figures have been revised accordingly. 5. Employment


Following an increase in the employment rate since early 2012, the rate decreased from the start of the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic in early 2020. There has largely been an increase since the end of 2020. In the latest quarter, the employment rate decreased and remains below pre-coronavirus levels. Part-time workers made the main contribution to the quarterly and annual decreases in the employment rate, while the number of full-time workers increased on the quarter and on the year.

The number of people in employment with second jobs increased in the latest quarter to 3.6% of all in employment.

We also publish estimates of payrolled employees in our <u>Earnings and employment from Pay As You Earn Real Time Information</u>, <u>UK bulletin</u> and estimates of the number of jobs in our <u>Vacancies and Jobs in the UK bulletin</u>.

Hours worked

The number of total actual weekly hours worked (explained in our Guide to labour market statistics) has been generally increasing in the UK since the relaxation of coronavirus lockdown measures but had been slightly decreasing since April to June 2022. In the latest period (December 2023 to February 2024), total actual weekly hours worked increased on the quarter, to 1.06 billion hours, and are above the level a year ago (December 2022 to February 2023). Both men's and women's hours worked increased on the quarter.

Average actual weekly hours worked have risen to 32.1 hours per week, increasing in the latest quarter and are above the level a year ago (December 2022 to February 2023). These increases are mainly caused by increases in the average actual weekly hours worked by full-time workers.

6. Unemployment


The unemployment rate had generally been falling from late 2013 until the start of the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic in early 2020. Thereafter it increased until the end of 2020 but had returned to pre-coronavirus rates. The unemployment rate has increased in the latest quarter. In December 2023 to February 2024, those unemployed for up to six months decreased in the latest quarter but remain above levels a year ago (December 2022 to February 2023). Meanwhile, those unemployed for over 6 and up to 12 months increased in the latest quarter, following falls in recent months, and those unemployed for over 12 months continued to increase in the latest quarter.

We also publish the <u>Claimant Count</u>, a measure of the number of people who are receiving a benefit principally for the reason of being unemployed.

7. Economic inactivity


The economic inactivity rate had been generally falling since comparable records began in 1971; however, it increased during the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic and fluctuated around this increased rate. In the latest quarter, the economic inactivity rate has increased slightly. Read detailed information about economic inactivity in our Guide to labour market statistics.

Increases in economic inactivity in the first year of the pandemic were largely driven by those aged 16 to 24 years. Following the pandemic, increases were driven by those aged 50 to 64 years.

Increases in economic inactivity over the latest quarter and since December 2022 to February 2023 were driven by those aged 16 to 34 years. These increases were partially offset by decreases among those aged 35 to 49 years.

The increase seen in economic inactivity in the latest quarter and over the year since December 2022 to February 2023 was mainly driven by those inactive because they were students and those inactive because of long-term sickness. These increases were partially offset by falls among those looking after the family or home and those inactive for other reasons.

We also publish estimates of economic inactivity by reason and age from the Annual Population Survey (APS) via Nomis. Latest APS estimates, up to January to December 2023, show the majority of those who were inactive because of long-term sickness were aged 50 to 64 years, although long-term sickness has been increasing across all age groups.

APS estimates have not been reweighted to the same populations as the Labour Force Survey (LFS). Consequently, all APS tables remain weighted to the previous population totals, which will be inconsistent with those used for the LFS in the latest periods. 8. Redundancies

The number of people reporting redundancy in the three months before interview increased in December 2023 to February 2024, by 0.6 per thousand employees compared with the previous quarter, to 3.9 per thousand employees. This is also an increase compared with a year ago (December 2022 to February 2023).

11. Glossary

Actual and usual hours worked

Statistics for <u>usual hours worked</u> measure how many hours people usually work per week. Compared with <u>actual hours worked</u>, they are not affected by absences and so can provide a better measure of normal working patterns. For example, a person who usually works 37 hours a week but who was on holiday for a week would be recorded as working zero actual hours for that week, while usual hours would be recorded as 37 hours.

Workers temporarily absent from a job as a result of the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic would still be classed as employed; however, they would be employed working no hours. This has directly affected estimates of total actual hours worked during the pandemic. Since the average actual weekly hours are the average of all in employment, those temporarily absent from a job also affected these estimates.

Claimant Count

The Claimant Count is an <u>official statistic in development</u> that measures the number of people who are receiving a benefit principally for the reason of being unemployed. Currently the Claimant Count consists of those receiving Jobseekers' Allowance, and Universal Credit claimants in the "searching for work" conditionality group.

Economic inactivity

People not in the labour force (also known as <u>economically inactive</u>) are not in employment but do not meet the internationally accepted definition of unemployment because they have not been seeking work within the last four weeks and/or are unable to start work in the next two weeks. The economic inactivity rate is the proportion of people aged between 16 and 64 years who are not in the labour force.

Employment

Employment measures the number of people in paid work or who had a job that they were temporarily away from (for example, because they were on holiday or off sick). This differs from the number of jobs because some people have more than one job. The employment rate is the proportion of people aged between 16 and 64 years who are in employment.

Workers furloughed under the Coronavirus Job Retention Scheme (CJRS), or those who were self-employed but temporarily not in work, had a reasonable expectation of returning to their jobs after a temporary period of absence. Therefore, they were classified as employed under the International Labour Organization (ILO) definition.

Redundancies

The redundancy estimates measure the number of people who were made redundant or who took voluntary redundancy in the three months before the Labour Force Survey interviews; it does not take into consideration planned redundancies.

Unemployment

Unemployment measures people without a job who have been actively seeking work within the last four weeks and are available to start work within the next two weeks. The unemployment rate is not the proportion of the total population that is unemployed. It is the proportion of the economically active population (that is, those in work plus those seeking and available to work) that is unemployed.

12. Measuring the data

This bulletin relies on data collected from the Labour Force Survey (LFS), the largest household survey in the UK.

Official statistics in development

These statistics are labelled as "official statistics in development". Until September 2023, these were called "experimental statistics". Read more about the change in our <u>Guide to official statistics in development</u>.

These statistics are based on information from the Labour Force Survey (LFS). The reweighting exercise has improved the representativeness of our LFS estimates for periods from July to September 2022, reducing potential bias in our estimates. Nonetheless, the ongoing challenges with response rates and levels mean that LFS-based labour market statistics are now badged as official statistics in development until further review. This is also in line with the letter from the Office for Statistics Regulation (OSR), stating that LFS statistics should not be published as accredited official statistics until OSR has reviewed them. We would advise caution when interpreting short-term changes in headline LFS rates and recommend using them as part of our suite of labour market indicators alongside workforce jobs, Claimant Count data and Pay As You Earn Real Time Information (PAYE RTI) estimates.

We are transforming how we collect and produce the LFS data to improve the quality of these statistics. We have published a <u>Labour market transformation article</u> providing an update on the transformation of labour market statistics. The Transformed Labour Force Survey will become the primary source of information on the labour market from September 2024.

13 . Strengths and limitations

Uncertainty in these data

The estimates presented in this bulletin contain <u>uncertainty</u>. For more information on uncertainty, please see our <u>Uncertainty and how we measure it for our surveys web page</u>.

The figures in this bulletin come from the Labour Force Survey (LFS), which gathers information from a sample of households across the UK rather than from the whole population. The sample is designed to be as accurate as possible, given practical limitations. Results from sample surveys are always estimates, not precise figures. This can have an impact on how changes in the estimates should be interpreted, especially for short-term comparisons. For more information on sampling, see Section 2 of our Uncertainty and how we measure it for our surveys webpage.

The data in this bulletin come from the Labour Force Survey, a survey of households. It is not practical to survey every household each quarter, so these statistics are estimates based on a large sample.

As the sample gets smaller, the variability of the estimates gets larger. Estimates for small groups, which are based on small subsets of the LFS sample, are less reliable and tend to be more volatile than for larger aggregated groups.

In general, changes in the numbers (and especially the rates) reported in this bulletin between quarters are small and are not usually greater than the level that can be explained by sampling variability. Short-term movements in reported rates should be considered alongside longer-term patterns in the series and corresponding movements in other sources to give a fuller picture.

Comparability

The data in this bulletin follow internationally accepted definitions specified by the <u>International Labour</u> <u>Organization (ILO)</u>. This ensures that the estimates for the UK are comparable with those for other countries.

Our annual <u>reconciliation report of job estimates article</u> compares the latest workforce jobs series estimates with the equivalent estimates of jobs from the LFS. It is usually published in March each year following the benchmarking of workforce jobs.

- 4. The headline inactivity rate is the number of people aged 16 to 64 divided by the population aged 16-64.
- 5. Data from Jun-Aug 2011 to Jun-Aug 2022 have been modelled to make them consistent with the new populations introduced in Jul-Sep 2022

Note on headline employment, unemployment and inactivity rates

The headline employment and inactivity rates are based on the population aged 16 to 64 but the headline unemployment rate is based on the economically active population aged 16 and over. The employment and inactivity rates for those aged 16 and over are affected by the inclusion of the retired population in the denominators and are therefore less meaningful than the rates for those aged from 16 to 64. However, for the unemployment rate for those aged 16 and over, no such effect occurs as the denominator for the unemployment rate is the economically active population which only includes people in work or actively seeking and able to work.

Note on headline employment, unemployment and inactivity levels

The headline employment and unemployment levels are for those aged 16 and over; they measure all people in work or actively seeking and able to work. However, the headline inactivity level is for those aged 16 to 64. The inactivity rate for those aged 16 and over is less meaningful as it includes elderly people who have retired from the labour force.
