## 1. Main points

- The Consumer Prices Index including owner occupiers' housing costs (CPIH) rose by 2.8% in the 12 months to June 2024, the same rate as the 12 months to May 2024.
- On a monthly basis, CPIH rose by 0.2% in June 2024, the same rate as in June 2023.
- The Consumer Prices Index (CPI) rose by 2.0% in the 12 months to June 2024, the same rate as the 12 months to May 2024.
- On a monthly basis, CPI rose by 0.1% in June 2024, the same rate as in June 2023.
- The largest upward contribution to the monthly change in both CPIH and CPI annual rates came from
  restaurants and hotels, where prices of hotels rose more than a year ago; the largest downward
  contribution came from clothing and footwear, with prices of garments falling this year having risen a year
  ago.
- Core CPIH (excluding energy, food, alcohol and tobacco) rose by 4.2% in the 12 months to June 2024, the same rate as in May; the CPIH goods annual rate fell from negative 1.3% to negative 1.4%, while the CPIH services annual rate rose from 5.9% to 6.0%.
- Core CPI (excluding energy, food, alcohol and tobacco) rose by 3.5% in the 12 months to June 2024, the same rate as in May; the CPI goods annual rate fell from negative 1.3% to negative 1.4%, while the CPI services annual rate remained at 5.7%.



The Consumer Prices Index including owner occupiers' housing costs (CPIH) rose by 2.8% in the 12 months to June 2024, the same rate as the 12 months to May, and down from a recent annual peak of 9.6% in October 2022.

Our <u>Consumer price inflation</u>, <u>historical estimates and recent trends article</u> suggests that the October 2022 inflation rate was the highest in over 40 years (the CPIH accredited official statistic series begins in January 2006). The annual rate in June 2024 has not been lower since July 2021, when it was 2.1%.

The monthly CPIH rate in June 2024 was 0.2%, the same rate as a year earlier.

The owner occupiers' housing costs (OOH) component of CPIH rose by 6.8% in the 12 months to June 2024, up from 6.7% in the 12 months to May. This is the highest annual rate since July 1992 in the constructed historical series. OOH costs rose by 0.6% on the month, compared with a 0.5% increase between May and June 2023.

The Consumer Prices Index (CPI) rose by 2.0% in the 12 months to June 2024, the same rate as the 12 months to May, and well below its recent annual peak of 11.1% in October 2022. Our indicative modelled consumer price inflation estimates suggest that the October 2022 peak was the highest rate in over 40 years (the CPI accredited official statistic series begins in January 1997). The annual rate in June 2024 has not been lower since April 2021, when it was 1.5%.

The monthly CPI rate in June 2024 was 0.1%, the same rate as it was in June 2023.

The main drivers of the annual inflation rate for CPIH and CPI are the same where they are common to both measures. However, the OOH component accounts for approximately 16% of the CPIH and is the main driver for differences between the CPIH and CPI inflation rates. This makes CPIH our most comprehensive measure of inflation. We describe this in more detail in <a href="Section 4: Latest movements in CPIH inflation">Section 4: Latest movements in CPIH inflation</a> and provide a commentary on the CPI in <a href="Section 5: Latest movements in CPI inflation">Section 5: Latest movements in CPI inflation</a>. We also discuss both CPIH and CPI in <a href="Section 3: Notable movements in prices">Section 3: Notable movements in prices</a>, though the figures reflect CPIH.

## 3. Notable movements in prices

The annual CPIH inflation rate in June 2024 reflected downward contributions from five divisions, offset by upward contributions from four. The largest upward effects came from restaurants and hotels, transport and housing and household services. The largest downward effect came from clothing and footwear.

### Restaurants and hotels

Prices for restaurants and hotels rose by 0.9% between May and June this year, compared with a lower monthly rise of 0.5% a year ago. The annual rate rose to 6.3% in the year to June 2024, up from 5.8% in the year to May.

The rise in the annual rate was almost entirely because of the price of hotels, which saw a monthly rise of 8.8%, a higher rate than the 1.7% a year earlier. This rise was partially offset by the price of restaurants and cafes which saw a monthly rise of 0.3%, lower than the 0.5% rise a year earlier.

## **Transport**

Prices in the transport division rose by 0.7% in the year to June 2024, compared with a rise of 0.3% in the year to May. This is the largest annual price rise since September 2023, where it was also 0.7%. On a monthly basis, prices fell by 0.2% this year, compared with a fall of 0.7% a year ago.

The increase in the annual rate was mainly because of second hand cars, where prices decreased by 0.3% on the month compared with a decrease of 1.9% a year ago. Second hand car prices decreased by 9.8% in the year to June 2024, the 11th consecutive month of annual decrease.

Maintenance and repairs of personal transport equipment and air fares also provided upward effects, although these were smaller in magnitude. Railway fares were one of the few categories to provide a counteracting negative effect.


The average price of petrol fell by 3.0 pence per litre between May and June 2024 to 145.8 pence per litre, up from 143.0 pence per litre in June 2023. Diesel prices fell by 4.8 pence per litre in June 2024 to stand at 151.5 pence per litre, up from 145.7 pence per litre in June 2023. These movements resulted in overall motor fuel prices rising by 2.6% in the year to June 2024, compared with a rise of 2.3% in the year to May.

## Clothing and footwear

Prices in the clothing and footwear division rose by 1.6% in the year to June 2024, compared with a rise of 3.0% in the year to May. On a monthly basis, prices fell by 1.2% this year, compared with a 0.2% rise a year ago. The fall in the annual rate was the result of downward effects from garments for women, garments for children, footwear for women, and garments for men. Prices in all of these categories apart from garments for children saw price falls in June 2024 coupled with a rise in the monthly price in June 2023. Monthly prices for garments for children fell in June 2024 at a greater rate than the fall in June 2023.

These price falls in the latest month may reflect a larger proportion of sales markers (indicating a temporary reduction in prices) in this division than occurred in June 2023.

Three items making particularly strong downward contributions were women's sportswear shorts, women's exercise leggings and girl's fashion tops. These items saw strong double digit monthly growth in June 2023 compared to price falls in June 2024.

## Food and non-alcoholic beverages

Prices of food and non-alcoholic beverages rose by 1.5% in the year to June 2024, down from 1.7% in the year to May. The June figure is the lowest annual rate since October 2021, when it was 1.3%, and compares with 17.4% a year ago. The annual rate has eased for the 15th consecutive month from a recent high of 19.2% in March 2023, the highest annual rate seen for over 45 years.


Prices rose by 0.2% in June 2024, compared with a monthly rise of 0.4% a year ago. Prices have been relatively high but stable since early summer 2023, compared with sharp rises over the previous 12 months.

Annual rates eased in 6 of the 11 food and non-alcoholic beverages classes, strengthened in 4 classes and remained the same in 1. The main downward effects came from a combination of bread and cereals, meat, and fruit.

Prices of meat fell this year, having risen last year, while prices of fruit fell at a faster rate than last year. While prices of bread and cereals rose on the month this year, the increase was at a slower rate than a year ago. The resulting annual rates were the lowest since October 2021 for meat (0.9%) and for bread and cereals (0.5%), and since August 2021 for fruit (1.6%).

The products making the largest downward contribution to the annual rate included packs of individual cakes, and crumpets. The largest upward contributions came from sponge cake, sugarless breakfast cereal, tinned tuna, kettle chips, and orange juice.


## 4. Latest movements in CPIH inflation

Figure 5 shows the annual inflation rates for the Consumer Prices Index including owner occupiers' housing costs (CPIH) series for all goods and all services, together with CPIH excluding energy, food, alcohol and tobacco (often referred to as core CPIH). The CPIH inflation rate is added for comparison.

The core CPIH annual inflation rate was 4.2% in June 2024, unchanged from last month and the joint lowest rate since January 2022. The recent peak of 6.5% in May 2023 was the highest rate since November 1991, when it was also 6.5%, as described in our <u>Consumer price inflation</u>, <u>historical estimates and recent trends</u>, <u>UK: 1950 to 2022 article</u>.

The CPIH all goods index fell by 1.4% in the 12 months to June 2024, compared with a fall of 1.3% in the 12 months to May. The largest downward effects came from alcoholic beverages and tobacco, and non-processed food.


The CPIH all services index rose by 6.0% in the 12 months to June 2024, slightly up from 5.9% in May. The largest upward effects came from package holidays and accommodation and from owner-occupied housing costs.

Figure 6 shows offsetting contributions from the 12 price divisions to the change in the annual CPIH inflation rate between May and June 2024. This month, the positive and negative contributions summed to zero, so the annual CPIH rate has remained at 2.8%.


The identical rates in May 2024 and June 2024 reflected downward contributions from five divisions offset by upward contributions from four divisions. The largest upward effects came from restaurants and hotels, transport, and housing and household services. The largest downward effect came from clothing and footwear.

Figure 7 shows the extent to which different categories of goods and services have contributed to the overall annual CPIH inflation rate. The contribution of each category to the annual rate depends on the price movement in that category, as well as its weight, which is updated annually.

The largest upward contributions to the annual CPIH inflation rate in June 2024 came from restaurants and hotels, as well as housing and household services. The contribution from restaurants and hotels rose slightly to 0.72 percentage points in June 2024, while the contribution from housing and household services also rose slightly, to 0.68.

The only negative contribution to the annual CPIH inflation rate came from furniture and household goods.


The contribution from food and non-alcoholic beverages eased for the 15th consecutive month, from a recent high of 1.76 percentage points in March 2023 to 0.15 percentage points in June 2024. This was the smallest contribution from this division since October 2021.

Figure 8 shows the contribution of owner occupiers' housing costs (OOH) and Council Tax, along with other housing components, to the annual CPIH inflation rate in the context of wider housing-related costs. The Consumer Prices Index (CPI) differs from the CPIH because it does not include these two components.

OOH's contribution rose from 1.06 to 1.09 percentage points between May and June 2024, and is the main driver behind the increased contribution from housing and household services overall. This is the highest contribution from OOH to the CPIH annual rate since at least January 2006.

## 5. Latest movements in CPI inflation

While the Consumer Prices Index including owner occupiers' housing costs (CPIH) is our lead and most comprehensive measure of consumer price inflation, the Consumer Prices Index (CPI) is based on a harmonised methodology developed by Eurostat, which allows for international comparisons to be drawn. 
Figure 9 shows CPI inflation for the UK against the EU and selected Group of Seven (G7) countries. While the UK CPI is produced on a comparable basis with EU countries, the US Harmonised Index of Consumer Prices (HICP) measure differs in some respects (see Footnote 1 of Figure 9). The UK's CPI inflation rate was below France's (2.5%) and Germany's (2.5%) in the 12 months to June 2024.



Figure 10 shows the annual inflation rates for the CPI all goods and all services series, together with CPI excluding energy, food, alcohol, and tobacco (often referred to as core CPI). The headline CPI inflation rate is added for comparison.

Core CPI rose by 3.5% in the year to June 2024, unchanged from last month and well below its recent high of 7.1% in the year to May 2023; this was the highest recorded since 7.2% in March 1992, as described in our Consumer price inflation, historical estimates and recent trends, UK: 1950 to 2022 article. The CPI all goods index fell by 1.4% in the year to June 2024, compared with a fall of 1.3% in the year to May. The CPI all services index rose by 5.7% in the year to June 2024. This was the same rate as the year to May 2024 and down from 7.4% in July 2023, which was the joint highest rate (with May 2023) since March 1992.


As with the all-items annual inflation rates, the drivers of CPIH and CPI goods and services inflation are the same, except for owner occupiers' housing costs (OOH) and Council Tax, which are excluded from CPI. The drivers are discussed in more detail in <u>Section 4: Latest movements in CPIH inflation</u>.

Figure 11 shows how each of the main groups of goods and services contributed to the change in the annual CPI inflation rate between May and June 2024.

The identical rates in May 2024 and June 2024 reflected downward contributions from six divisions, offset by upward contributions from four divisions. The largest upward effects came from restaurants and hotels, and transport. The largest downward effect came from clothing and footwear.


Although the sizes of the contributions differ from CPIH, the main drivers to the change are the same where they are common to both measures.

Figure 12 shows the extent to which the distinct categories of goods and services have contributed to the overall annual CPI inflation rate over the last two years.

The CPIH includes extra housing components not included in the CPI. This can result in the largest contributions to the annual CPI and CPIH inflation rates coming from different divisions. In June 2024, the largest contributing division was the same: restaurants and hotels (0.88 percentage point contribution to the CPI rate). However, housing and household services made a large negative contribution to CPI compared with a large positive contribution to CPIH. Cheaper gas and electricity prices this year compared to a year ago resulted in the negative contribution to CPI, but in CPIH, these were more than offset by upward contributions from OOH and Council Tax.

## 7. Glossary

### **Annual inflation rate**

The most common approach to measuring inflation is the 12-month or annual inflation rate, which compares prices for the latest month with the same month a year ago. In any given month, the annual rate is determined by the balance between upward and downward price movements of the range of goods and services included in the index.

## **Consumer price inflation**

Consumer price inflation is the rate at which the prices of goods and services bought by households rise or fall. It is estimated by using price indices. ## Consumer Prices Index including owner occupiers' housing costs (CPIH)

The CPIH is the most comprehensive measure of inflation. It extends the Consumer Prices Index (CPI) to include a measure of the costs associated with owning, maintaining, and living in one's own home, known as owner occupiers' housing costs (OOH), along with Council Tax. Both are significant expenses for many households and are not included in the CPI.

### **Consumer Prices Index**

The CPI is a measure of consumer price inflation produced to international standards and is based on European regulations for the <u>Harmonised Index of Consumer Prices</u>. The CPI is the inflation measure used in the government's target for inflation.

The CPI is produced at the same level of detail as the CPIH in our <u>accompanying dataset</u> and <u>accompanying dataset</u> and <u>accompanying dataset</u>.

## **Retail Prices Index (RPI)**

The RPI does not meet the required standard for designation as an <u>accredited official statistic</u>. In recognition that it continues to be widely used in contracts, we continue to publish the RPI, its subcomponents, and RPI excluding mortgage interest payments (RPIX). To view the all-items RPI, please see the <u>data time series section of the inflation and price indices area of our website</u>. The annual RPI inflation rate was 2.9% in June 2024.

The UK Statistics Authority (The Authority) and HM Treasury launched a consultation in 2020 on The Authority's proposal to address the shortcomings of the RPI. From 2030 (at the earliest), as outlined in <a href="The Authority's response to the consultation">The Authority's response to the consultation</a>, the CPIH methods and data sources will be introduced into the RPI. Additionally, the supplementary and lower-level indices of the RPI will be discontinued.

## 8. Measuring the data

### Alternative data sources

We are undertaking a programme of transformation across our consumer price statistics, including identifying new sources, improving methods, and developing systems. More information about the project and our ongoing transformation plans can be found in our updated Research and developments in the transformation of UK consumer price statistics article, released on 1 December 2023. The latest release includes information on the transformation of consumer price statistics on second-hand cars and private rents, which we introduced with the February 2024 index, and our proposed approach to outlier detection in grocery scanner data.

## Weights for 2024 consumer price inflation statistics

In line with usual practice at the start of each year, the expenditure weights used to compile the consumer price inflation statistics were updated. For the Consumer Prices Index including owner occupiers' housing costs (CPIH) and the Consumer Prices Index (CPI), they were calculated using national accounts household final consumption expenditure (HHFCE) data for 2022. This is in line with our standard methodology of using data lagged by two years.

It differs from the approach used over the last few years, when there were large changes seen in spending patterns because of the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic. Over these years, we adjusted the spending data so that the resulting weights were more reflective of the year immediately before use in consumer price inflation. More information on weights updating is available in our <u>Consumer price inflation</u>, <u>updating weights articles</u>.

The weights for the Retail Prices Index (RPI) were also updated for 2024 in line with the practice followed both before and during the pandemic period, with no additional adjustment to the spending data because of any coronavirus effects.

The weights used to produce the CPI and CPIH have historically been rounded to integers as parts per thousand of the all items indices. From 2024, we are now using unrounded weights in compiling the indices. The RPI continues to be based on integer weights.

## Households and the cost of living

To help individuals understand how the rise in inflation affects their expenditure, we have produced a <u>personal inflation calculator</u>. The calculator allows users to enter the amount they spend across either a reduced or a wide range of categories, to produce an estimate of their personal inflation based on those spending patterns.

Our <u>shopping prices comparison tool</u> shows how the average prices of items have changed over time. As a result, the number of average price series in Table 55 in our <u>Consumer price inflation dataset</u> has been reduced to two, covering petrol and diesel, and Table 54 has been discontinued. The average price data originally presented in these tables are currently still available as time series on our website and can be found using the four-character identifiers in Table 55.

On 30 May 2024, we published our quarterly <u>Household Costs Indices (HCIs)</u> for UK household groups bulletin. The HCIs reflect how different types of households experience changing prices and differ from CPIH and CPI, which are based on recognised economic principles and which provide an aggregate measure of inflation for household spending in the UK.

The HCIs are official statistics in development and this release included new estimates for January to March 2024. It was not possible for this latest release to update the weights in January and February 2024 in line with the standard methodology for consumer prices. This is because of delays in processing the underlying survey data and the need for further ongoing quality assurance. Instead, the most recent estimates have been compiled using the weights for February to December 2023. We expect the underlying survey data to be available in time for our next publication on 28 August 2024. We will revise at this point to incorporate updated weights back to January 2024.

## Consumer price inflation historical estimates, UK, 1950 to 1988

On 18 May 2022, we published our <u>Consumer price inflation</u>, <u>historical estimates</u>, <u>UK</u>, <u>1950 to 1988 -- methodology</u> and <u>Consumer price inflation</u>, <u>historical estimates and recent trends</u>, <u>UK</u>: <u>1950 to 2022 article</u>. These include new estimates of CPIH and improved estimates of CPI for the period 1950 to 1988. These estimates (published in response to user need for a longer series) are indicative and are for analytical purposes only. They are not intended for official use and do not constitute part of the accredited official statistic series.

Previously, in December 2018, we published our <u>Consumer Prices Index including owner occupiers' housing costs (CPIH) historical series: 1988 to 2004 article</u>. This series is also not an accredited official statistic, reflecting the historical uncertainty around the backcasts.

## **Methodology information**

The consumer price indices are normally based on prices collected from outlets around the country, supplemented by information collected centrally over the internet and by phone. The figures in this publication use data collected on or around 11 June 2024.

Our <u>Consumer price indices</u>, a <u>brief guide</u> gives an overview of consumer price statistics, while our <u>Consumer prices indices technical manual</u> covers the concepts and methodologies underpinning the indices in more detail.

Our <u>CPIH Compendium</u> provides a comprehensive source of information on the CPIH, focusing on the approach to measuring owner occupiers' housing costs.

## 9 . Strengths and limitations

We explained our approach to <u>Measuring changing prices and costs for consumers and households</u> most recently in our December 2023 article using three "use cases", and described how they relate to the measures published and under development.

These cases refer to the Consumer Prices Index including owner occupiers' housing costs (CPIH) as our lead measure of inflation based on economic principles. They also refer to the Household Costs Indices (HCIs) as a set of measures that reflect the change in costs and prices experienced by different households, and the Retail Prices Index (RPI) as a legacy measure that is required to meet existing user needs. Our <a href="Shortcomings of the RPI">Shortcomings of the RPI</a> as a measure of inflation article describes the issues with the RPI.


