1. Main points

- The number of new online job adverts decreased by 8% in August 2025 compared with July 2025 but remained broadly unchanged when compared with August 2024 (Textkernel).
- When asked in September 2025, 17% of trading businesses had no cash reserves saved, a 5 percentage
 point increase from September 2024; 35% of businesses responded that they had cash reserves to last
 between one and six months, a 9 percentage point fall from September 2024 (initial results from Wave 141
 of the Business Insights and Conditions Survey).
- Total Revolut debit card expenditure remained broadly unchanged in the week to 21 September 2025 compared with the previous week but increased by 14% when compared with the equivalent week of 2024 (Revolut).
- The total number of ship visits to major UK ports decreased by 4% in the week to 21 September 2025 compared with the previous week, and decreased by 10% when compared with the equivalent week of 2024 (exactEarth).
- The seasonally adjusted number of daily UK flights decreased by 1% in the week to 21 September 2025 compared with the previous week but increased by 1% when compared with the equivalent week of 2024 (EUROCONTROL).
- The System Average Price (SAP) of gas decreased by 1% in the week to 21 September 2025 compared with the previous week, but the System Price of electricity increased by 13% over the same period (National Gas Transmission, Elexon).
- The total number of Energy Performance Building Certificates (EPCs) for new dwellings in England and Wales increased by 10% in the week to 21 September 2025, and increased by 33% when compared with the equivalent week of 2024 (Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government).

These are official statistics in development, and we advise caution when using the data. The data sources used to compile these indicators are regularly reviewed to ensure they are representative and relevant, which may mean indicators change at short notice. Notes:

The total number of new online job adverts decreased by 8% to 696,000 in August 2025 compared with July 2025. This is in line with the usual seasonal pattern over the summer holiday period but remained broadly unchanged when compared with August 2024.

The number of new online job adverts decreased in 13 of the 26 occupation groups in August 2025 when compared with August 2024. For the remaining 13 occupation groups, 12 increased and 1 remained broadly unchanged.

The occupation groups that saw the largest percentage decreases were "Health professionals" and "Customer service occupations", which decreased by 19% and 15%, respectively, when compared with August 2024. The largest percentage increases over this period were "Business, media and public service professionals" and "Science, research, engineering and technology professionals", which increased by 16% and 13%, respectively.

The number of new online job adverts decreased in 7 of the 12 regions (includes UK countries and English regions) in August 2025 when compared with August 2024.

The largest percentage decrease was in the West Midlands, decreasing by 5%, while the largest percentage increase was in London, increasing by 5%.

5. Glossary

Real-time indicator

A real-time indicator provides insights into economic activity using close-to-real-time big data, administrative data sources, rapid response surveys or experimental estimates, which represent useful economic and social concepts.

Seasonal adjustment

Seasonal adjustment is the identification and removal of consistent and systematic variation in time series associated with the time of year. Seasonality

Seasonal fluctuations are likely to be present in many of these indicators, so caution must be applied when interpreting changes in series that are not seasonally adjusted.
