# Economic activity and social change in the UK, real-time indicators: 2 October 2025

# 1 . Main points

- Nearly a quarter (23%) of businesses reported that they are currently using some form of artificial intelligence (AI) technology in late September 2025, up 3 percentage points from June 2025; this proportion has been steadily increasing since the question was introduced in September 2023 (9%) (final results from Wave 141 of the Business Insights and Conditions Survey).
- The total number of ship visits to major UK ports increased by 2% in the week to 28 September 2025, compared with the previous week, but decreased by 5% when compared with the equivalent week of 2024 (exactEarth).
- The seasonally adjusted number of Daily UK Flights increased by 1% in the week to 28 September 2025, compared with the previous week, and increased by 1% when compared with the equivalent week of 2024 (EUROCONTROL).
- The System Price of electricity increased by 56% in the week to 28 September 2025, compared with the previous week from 5.603 pence per kilowatt hour (p/kWh) to 8.753 p/kWh, and increased by 13% compared with the equivalent week of last year (Elexon).
- The System Average Price (SAP) of gas increased by 1% in the week to 28 September 2025, compared with the previous week from 2.722 p/kWh to 2.737 p/kWh, but decreased by 11% compared with the equivalent week of last year (National Gas Transmission).
- The number of Energy Performance Building Certificates (EPCs) lodged for new dwellings in England and Wales decreased by 7% in the week to 28 September 2025, but increased by 4% when compared with the equivalent week of 2024 (Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government).

These are official statistics in development, and we advise caution when using the data. The data sources used to compile these indicators are regularly reviewed to ensure they are representative and relevant, which may mean indicators change at short notice. ## 2 . Latest indicators at a glance

### Notes:

1. Card spending over time increased because of the impacts of both inflation on value of transactions and cash-to-card conversion.
2. Revolut adjustments to user count are at an aggregate level and as such age bands may not adjust evenly.
3. Indicators with “SA” in the title have been seasonally adjusted.
4. Existing weekly EPC data can show sudden spikes when housing associations lodge multiple expired EPCs at once.

## 4 . Glossary

### Real-time indicator

A real-time indicator provides insights into economic activity using close-to-real-time big data, administrative data sources, rapid response surveys, or experimental estimates, which represent useful economic and social concepts.

### Seasonal adjustment

Seasonal adjustment is the identification and removal of consistent and systematic variation in time series associated with the time of year.
